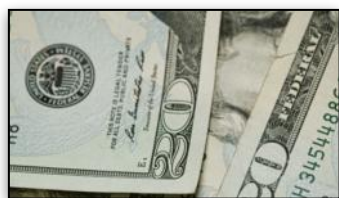

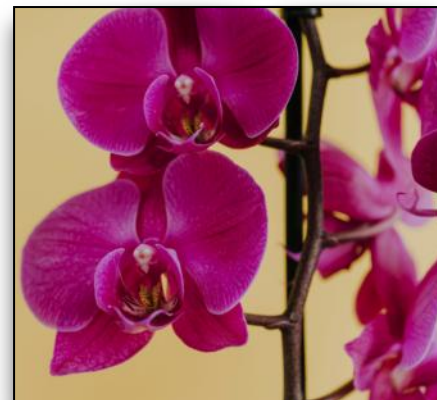

Possible FALL Work Project

We are exploring several fall work projects for RCA in southern California, though it hinges upon suitable housing arrangements being available for the work team. We would be working again with Hope Crisis Response Network as we did during the Paradise projects of 2022 & 2023. The two areas needing assistance are a flood damaged area in San Diego and fire disaster recovery work in Los

Angeles. Unfortunately, HCRN has lost its volunteer housing site in San Diego and is still looking for suitable possibilities in the Pasadena area near Altadena. Below is a brief description of the two sites and the work being done by volunteers thru HCRN.

SAN DIEGO

Massive flooding last January (10 inches of rain in 2 days) overwhelmed creeks and drainage systems in a low income area of San Diego. 1800 homes were damaged and 95% of the homes were not insured. A long-term recovery has begun and several Cal-Nev VIM teams have already helped out, prior to the loss of the volunteer housing. UMCOR is involved in the recovery effort.

ALTADENA-PACIFIC PALISADES

HCRN has begun recovery work in both these burned areas, cleaning and repairing homes that have smoke and other damage from the January fires. Hopefully by fall, HCRN will be able to work out volunteer

housing arrangements for volunteer teams

More information will be forthcoming as we are able to get some dates to share either by email or hopefully by the RCA luncheon at Annual Conference. In the meantime, if you have questions or just want to let us know of your interest, please feel free to contact one of us!

BEWARE OF SCAMS! An ongoing series.

When CAPTCHA isn't.

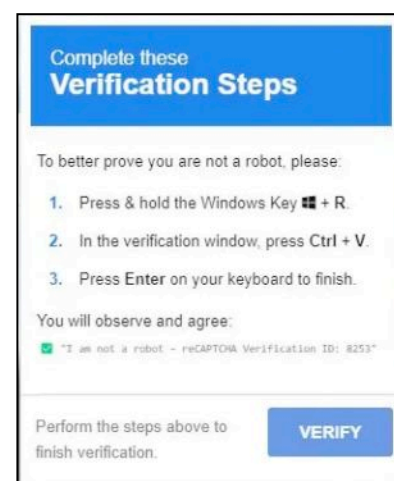

You are probably familiar with CAPTCHA security challenges that enable websites to distinguish between humans and bots by asking visitors to type in characters or select the correct objects in an image. Recently scammers began distributing malware through fake CAPTCHAs by adding so-called “verification steps.” The fake CAPTCHAs can be found on any ordinary website through ads accepted by the site or by other compromised content.

The threat actor tricks website visitors into executing malicious code on their device by following the instructions in the fake CAPTCHA. This code downloads and executes malware that can steal passwords, cookies, and cryptocurrency wallet details from a user’s device. The so-called “verification steps” can include:

- Press Win + R (this opens the Run dialog box);
- Press CTRL + V (this pastes the line from the clipboard into the text field);
- Press Enter (this executes the code).

The fake CAPTCHAs can be found on any ordinary website through ads accepted by the site or by other compromised content. To protect yourself from malware threats, be cautious of suspicious CAPTCHA pages. If anything on the CAPTCHA page seems out of place or unusual, it is best to avoid interacting with it. Above all, do not follow instructions like those show above.



FAKE!

Protect yourself from fake CAPTCHA pages

Legitimate CAPTCHA pages are usually found on websites that require user verification, such as login or account creation pages. Simply visiting a site with CAPTCHA or clicking the “Verify you are human checkbox” will not install malware. Here’s what to watch out for:

- Avoid anything suspicious: Be cautious of CAPTCHA pages that appear on unexpected websites or in applications, especially if they have extra verification steps. The run dialog (Windows Key + R) should rarely be used, and a website should never need you to run commands using this method.
- Verify Websites: Always check the website's URL to ensure it is legitimate.
- Keep Tech Updated: Keep your software and operating system up to date and patch vulnerabilities that could be exploited by malware.

Helpful Information on Identification

If you or one of your loved ones is worried about having the necessary ID in these times, here is a summary of how to acquire these items

1. ACCESSING YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT. The Social Security Administration now also requires final entry to your online social security account through Login.gov. Both SSA and Login.gov ALSO now require two-factor authentication -- when you try to login they ask for a code which they send to your phone and you must enter the code at the website. So, for future access to your online account at the SSA, you must: (a) already have or set up an account at SSA <https://www.ssa.gov/> (with two-factor authentication) and (b) already have or set up an account at Login.gov <https://login.gov/> (with two-factor authentication) then (c) follow the instructions to link your SSA account to your to Login.gov account. It takes several steps to get this done.

2. BIRTH CERTIFICATE. The Brennan Center for Justice says that an estimated 7% of U.S. citizens do not have a birth certificate. (Records were destroyed; home birth never reported; disconnect between hospital and county recorder; naturalized citizen born elsewhere; etc.) For people whose birth was officially registered in the U.S., in the future showing a certified birth certificate may be necessary to: register to vote; reconfirm an existing voter registration; apply for a passport; change your voter registration name; or for any of several other types of transactions. You can get a certified copy of a birth certificate from the State Vital Records Office or the County Clerk where you were born for a nominal charge. Buy several copies.

3. PASSPORT. Only about 48% of U.S. Citizens have a U.S. Passport. You apply for passport through <https://travel.state.gov/content/travel.html> (adult, child under 16, child age 16 or 17). A certified birth certificate is one of the most common ways to prove citizenship.
